



Week: May11-15 Rhyme of the week: Itsy Bitsy Spider, Vocabulary Cards: spider, spout, rain, sun
PAGES DO NOT NEED TO BE PRINTED-Work may be completed on a separate sheet of paper
Monday- Letter Cluster: R, r, D, d, V, v, U, u, Y, y
Have child point to the letters and say their name and sound. (pg.2)
Have child build letters with items available at home such as popsicle sticks, playdoh, cotton balls.

Tuesday- Review Name/Sound: Letter hunt
Have child identify letters <b>R, r, D, d</b> in their environment (newspapers, cereal boxes, shoe boxes, etc.)

Rhyming Recite nursery rhyme Itsy Bitsy Spider. (pg.3)
Have child color (point/draw) the pictures that rhyme. (pg. 4)
Ask child to name other words that rhyme with picture cards. (made up words are acceptable ex: pouse, mouse)

Have child name pictures and clap the syllables of each word. Circle or point to the correct number of syllables. (pg.5)
Practice the same activity using different movements (stomp, tap, etc.)
